<u>Presentation of the project leader - Example</u>

P.A.D.E.M. (Aid and Development Programs for Children of the World) is a non-governmental organization of international solidarity created in 2002. Its primary objective is to help the most deprived children. Private, apolitical, non-denominational and non-profit making, PADEM works everywhere in the world, in favor of a lasting improvement of the living conditions of the most vulnerable populations, in particular children, through sustainable education, health, access to water and sanitation, economic development as well as habitat improvement.

PADEM's main expertise is coaching and building the capacity of local partners. PADEM is indeed characterized by its ability to identify and work with local structures on themes and with a very varied audience.

Recognized in the general interest in France and approved by the Luxembourg Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the NGO PADEM has been active for 15 years now in many countries.

PADEM's actions are based above all on partnership with local civil society actors and the constant search for the fulfillment of the fundamental rights of beneficiaries with the strictest respect for their culture.

Thus, a global approach is most often preferred. Taking into account all of the issues makes it possible to better respond to the needs of the populations, to ensure long-term sustainability and a strong impact. In keeping with these values, PADEM will strongly favor a holistic approach to a problem.

PADEM carries out all of its projects in partnership with local civil society actors. PADEM is currently carrying out 38 projects in different countries (Kosovo, Mongolia, India, Sri Lanka, Kenya, Senegal, Peru, Bolivia), several of which are co-funded, and had its first framework agreement with the Luxembourg Ministry of Foreign Affairs on the subject of protection. of childhood (2017-2019) for the realization of twelve projects.

All PADEM projects currently in progress or completed are managed assiduously, both from an accounting and operational point of view. Intermediate and final reports are submitted on time to the various financial partners and any discrepancies between forecasts and achievements are duly justified. Regular missions in the field make it possible to maintain a close relationship with local partners as well as with the beneficiaries, but also to report on the achievements made.
