"Express yourself": speak out, lodge a complaint, make a claim...

# **EMPLOYMENT**

#### The staff delegation - the works delegate :

Ensures equal treatment in terms of access to employment, training, professional promotion, pay and working conditions. It can intervene at the level of the hierarchical superior and accompany the victim.

#### Le Service psychosocial de la fonction publique :

This service supports victims by providing information on the harassment procedure, the steps to take and how to build a case.

# **EDUCATION**

# The delegate-referent:

It acts as a spokesperson for pupils in their dealings with teachers and educational staff, and can help the victim by alerting the appropriate services.

# Psycho-social and school support services (SePAS) and Socio-educational services (SSE):

These services are available in secondary schools and are staffed by psychologists, social workers and educators trained to support young victims of bullying. They provide a listening ear, support and information.

#### School mediation service :

A body that can receive complaints concerning the school's fundamental missions with the aim of finding an amicable solution between the parties. The complainant must first contact the person directly concerned by the complaint or his/her immediate superior.
